- Looking out for, and dealing with (and if necessary, reporting) student welfare and pastoral care issues.
- Planning and delivering engaging, fun evening and weekend activities that are suited to both age
 and ability. It is vital that you have the creativity and experience to be able to actively contribute
 ideas for both sport and non-sport related sessions
- Supervising students on weekday and weekend excursions to ensure they have a fun-packed day out!
- Escorting students to/from airports on arrival and departure days
- Checking In and supervising new arrivals at weekends, making sure they are made to feel welcomed and have a tour of the school site

House Parents oversee the smooth running of student accommodation (Houses), working with a Residential Activity Leader.

They play an active role in managing student welfare, behaviour and discipline and safeguarding, including health & safety. They are the 'go to' people when a student has any personal issues or problems.

Together with the Residential Activity Leader, they:

Ensure students are prepared for their classes, excursions and activities

- Ensure that students know their timetable, where to go and at what time every day
- Lead welcome meetings for new students
- Lead daily evening house meetings and the distribution of pocket money for excursions
- Carry out daily room checks
- Report any House issues or damage
- Make sure their House is suitable decorated and that notice boards are kept up to date with statutory information, timetables, daily and weekly excursion and activity programmes etc.
- House Parents work closely with the Centre Manager and Welfare Manager to communicate, manage and report welfare and behavioural issues
- House Parents also run activities sessions as well as supervising students on weekend excursions, escorting students to/from airports on arrival and departure days and welcoming new arrivals at check-in and giving school site tours.
